

THE WOODVILLE TOWNSHIP TRUSTEE'S REGULAR MEETING – April 19, 2023

Chairman Bill Hammer called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

EMS – Assistant Chief Mike McGinnis stated that EMS calls are back to pre-pandemic numbers. LS 19 had 29 runs in March with 14 transports to area hospitals.

The new squad continues progressing quickly on the production line at Horton. The county invited the Trustees to go with them to Horton on May 2 to pick up their two new squads and complete the township's squad's mid-inspection.

LS19 needed the AC recharged and an ABS sensor was bad. They are waiting on parts.

FIRE DEPARTMENT – Fire Chief Tim Schnitker was absent but sent the following report:

1. The department will be participating in a mock accident at Woodmore High School on May 12 with the Harris-Elmore Fire Department.
2. Mark Grove is working on getting quotes for the generator. Winco is now owned by Generac.
3. The department's cell phone was officially switched to FirstNet on April 18.

Trustee Green made a motion to approve the payment of \$3,255 for the 1st Quarter, 2023 firefighter's compensation program for runs and training. Trustee Runion seconded. All answered yes to roll call. Motion passed.

ZONING – Zoning Inspector Steve Michaelis reported on the following:

- The Zoning Commission will hold a public hearing on April 26th to consider adding language to the zoning resolution regarding solar arrays.
- Millerschones– I wrote an informational permit about the project they are doing with the landscape in the front yard as no actual zoning permit was needed. I also wrote an informational permit stating they are installing solar on their roof.
- Regarding the certified letters that were mailed out – the letters for William Linke and Mary Rupke were returned unclaimed. Still have not received the letter sent to Tom Linke.

CEMETERY – Workers have begun mowing and seeding new graves and then applying a straw blanket for faster growth.

ROAD DEPARTMENT

Trustee Hammer made a motion to purchase Internet/WiFi services at the road garage and to purchase an Arlo-style camera system to monitor the area up to \$3,000. Trustee Green seconded. All answered yes to roll call. Motion passed.

The Trustees signed an updated work-in-the right of way plan for Frontier who now plans to bore more of their wire than have aerial for a project at TR 28 & TR 165.

FISCAL OFFICER – No report.

Trustee Green made a motion to approve the warrants. Trustee Hammer seconded. All answered yes to roll call. Motion passed. Trustee Runion made a motion to approve the April 5, 2023 meeting minutes. Trustee Green seconded. All answered yes to roll call. Motion passed.

At 8:16 pm, with no further business, Trustee Green moved for adjournment. Trustee Runion seconded. This meeting was held in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code's Sunshine Law.
