

THE WOODVILLE TOWNSHIP TRUSTEE'S REGULAR MEETING – June 21, 2023

Chairman Bill Hammer called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

EMS – Sandusky County EMS Chief Jeff Jackson reported the following:

- LS19 had 28 runs in May with 18 transports to area hospitals.
- As you can see the new squad is in service. We do have a couple of bugs to work out. We are working with the ambulance manufacturer to get these resolved as soon as possible.
- The Sandusky County Administrator is sending the truck lease over to the Prosecutor's office for review before being sent to the County Commissioners.
- The old ambulance is ready to be returned, we will get it back here once the parking lot sealing project is complete.
- We will be bringing out the Sandusky County EMS safety trailer next week for the upcoming festival.

FIRE DEPARTMENT – Fire Chief Tim Schnitker was not able to be present, but sent the following update on the activities of the fire department:

1. R-1 has an Air Conditioner leak and we are waiting on parts to schedule the repair. While at WW Williams for diagnostics, they damaged one of the steps. They are getting the parts to repair that at the same time.
2. The X-3 batteries died. I replaced them but the sure power line looked like the batteries were dead. I had Williams do a quick diagnostic and it is not the new batteries or the alternator.
3. F&M Mechanical can repair the overhead exhaust fans for \$735. One had a broken belt and the other had a seized-up motor and the belt was shot. They moved the track for LS19's bay, but it is not long enough due to the exhaust being behind the wheel. He has extra track to extend it out for \$300 and will not add labor costs. **Trustee Green made a motion to authorize up to \$1,500 for the repair work to the exhaust system by F&M Mechanical. Trustee Runion seconded. All answered yes to roll call. Motion passed.**
4. Morlock Asphalt is in this week for sealing of the parking lot.
5. L&K Tire Service revised their bid to state bid pricing on the tires for R-1, X-3, & X-5. The total is \$10,151.64 and Speck Tires bid \$10,464.38 for the exact same tires. L&K is a bit cheaper as they are donating the tires for the trailer that carries X-6. They will do the work here in the station. **Trustee Green made a motion to purchase the tires from L&K Tire Service, Bellevue, in the amount of \$10,151.64 for all new tires on R-1, X-3, and X-5. Trustee Runion seconded. All answered yes to roll call. Motion passed.**
6. The truck committee met Monday and we are working on the tool placement so we can get that to them soon. We went over the striping package. We will go with the black reflective stripe and add yellow pin stripe above and below similar to the white on LS19. This will give better visibility in both day and night.
7. Seth Parkhurst is going to be cover the Gibsonburg parade for us. He will take X-5. The department will also be at the Gibsonburg Fireworks.
8. The Fire Department was given the Award of Heroism from the Safety Council of NW Ohio in recognition of our actions at the turnpike accident on December 23, 2022. The Firefighters who were on the call attended the event to receive the award – Mike Brzeczek, Brandon Westerman, Matt Depner, Tim Meighan, Seth Parkhurst, and Caleb O'Connor,
9. Mark Grove has been out to Martin Marietta several times working with the new Safety Personnel on things around the plant and the new wind turbines. The company has been very interactive with us.
10. The Fire Department will present a "Fireworks Safety" program on June 28 at the Woodville Library.
11. The department is recruiting new firefighters and will hold an open house from 6-8 pm on June 29 to explain the training and requirements needed to join the department.
12. The Woodville Fire Department will hose down the fireworks field at 8 pm June 28. Kids and adults are welcome to come and watch, check out the trucks, and play in the water.
13. The next American Red Cross bloodmobile at the station will be on June 30 and then again on July 28 from noon to 5 pm.

ZONING – No report.

CEMETERY – Workers continue mowing, but it is slowing down since there has been no rain.

ROAD DEPARTMENT – Road Supervisor Jim Busdiecker reported on the following:

- Gary Hoodlebrink fixed the cylinder on the boom mower.
- The new, used grinder is working well.
- Morlock Asphalt will be in to seal the driveway at the road garage and the fire station parking lot this week.
- We will clean the ditch on TR 42 soon now that the boom mower is fixed.
- I mowed the riverbank by the carnival grounds at Trailmarker Park today for the Village of Woodville.
- Transmission lines down SR 582 crossing TR 16 are being upgraded by a contractor for Toledo Edison.

FISCAL OFFICER – No report.

Election Day is August 8th for a special election. Woodville Township residents can vote at the fire station. On this ballot is Issue I - a proposed constitutional amendment.

Trustee Green made a motion to approve the warrants. Trustee Runion seconded. All answered yes to roll call. Motion passed. Trustee Runion made a motion to approve the June 7, 2023 meeting minutes. Trustee Green seconded. All answered yes to roll call. Motion passed.

At 7:36 pm, with no further business, Trustee Green moved for adjournment. Trustee Runion seconded. This meeting was held in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code's Sunshine Law.
