

THE WOODVILLE TOWNSHIP TRUSTEE'S REGULAR MEETING - May 17, 2017

This regular meeting of the Woodville Township Trustees was held on May 17, 2017. Those in attendance: Trustees: Chairman Bill Hammer, Paul Heineman, Ken Green, Fiscal Officer Lori Kepus, Road Supervisor Jim Busdiecker, Seasonal worker Wayne Sandrock (left at 9 pm), Zoning Inspector Steve Michaelis, Fire Captain Joe Kopp and Assistant Fire Chief Dave Miller (both left at 7:30 pm). Township resident Gary Thomasson (left at 8:15 pm) Township Zoning Commission Member Bob Schroeder (left at 9 pm). Fire Chief Bill Andrews was on vacation.

Trustee Hammer called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Trustee Heineman made a motion to approve the minutes from the May 3, 2017 regular meeting. Trustee Green seconded. All answered yes to roll call. Motion passed. Trustee Green made a motion to approve the warrants. Trustee Heineman seconded. All answered yes to roll call. Motion passed.

EMS – No report.

ZONING – Zoning Inspector Steve Michaelis reported that the Woodville Township Zoning Commission held their May 10 meeting and discussed possible changes and revisions to the township zoning resolution. The suggestions should be finalized by their next meeting in July.

Mr. Michaelis presented one approved zoning permit for Gary Hoodlebrink, 1256 Fort Findlay Road, Woodville, on behalf of his son Greg Hoodlebrink who is adding a 24' x 26' garage and 26' x 23' addition to this house. The \$50 permit fee was paid.

Jose Escobar, TR 165, Woodville, wants to put up a pole barn on a ½ acre lot to temporarily store animals and feed for his granddaughter's 4-H project. According to the township's zoning resolution, the lot is not big enough for this use. The Trustees suggested a permit be issued for agricultural use only that states in writing that in the future it can never be used as a building for storage.

Gary Thomasson attended the meeting to ask about putting up a pole barn. The proposed location of the pole barn would be in front of his house and this does not meet the township's zoning code. He was referred to work with the zoning inspector to file a variance request.

CEMETERY – Seasonal worker Wayne Sandrock reported that workers are busy mowing and poured six foundations last week with the help of Trustee Green. He also said that he spoke with Chris Detray, Crosser Monument Company, about the monument restoration project at the old Woodville Cemetery. Chris stated that there are a few stones they repaired last year that still need a little attention and they would like to fix those.

The prison workers from the County's Community Work Program were at the cemeteries weeding two days last week and did a very good job.

ROADS – Road Supervisor Jim Busdiecker will return to light duty work on May 22 and will begin road mowing.

Trustee Hammer stated that Virginia Swartz, 1047 Fort Findlay Road, Woodville contacted him and gave him a copy of a contract from Matt Tille Enterprises to clean up the remaining debris at the barn that was torn down last year.

Trustee Hammer made a motion to adopt Resolution 2017-05 to amend Resolution 2017-04 and to accept the modified version of the RUMA agreement dated May, 2017. Trustee Green seconded. All answered yes to roll call. Motion passed.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

- Joe Kopp and Mike Brzeczek attended a "train the trainer" driving school May 6 and 7 at Promedica in Sylvania. Joe stated that to train the other members of the department correctly, they would need to purchase a set of six video tapes. Trustee Green made a motion to purchase the necessary videos up to \$500. Trustee Heineman seconded. All answered yes to roll call. Motion passed.
- Joe, Mike, Chief Andrews, and Mark Grove attended an Enlightened Volunteer officers training class May 11 at Bowling Green State University. It was not as enlightening as we thought Joe said, but we did pick up some good information.
- Dave Miller stated that the department has two thermal cameras. One is 10 years old and is not reliable. Their other unit is 20 years old. They would like to replace the 20 year old camera and keep the 10 year old camera for a backup. The cameras run around \$8,500. They will gather quotes.
- The parts have finally arrived at Wonderly Collision and Rescue I will be fixed soon.
- The department will participate in Woodville's Memorial Day Parade on May 29 at 8:30 a.m.
- The department will participate in the Genoa Parade on June 2 at 6:30 p.m.
- The department will participate in a water rescue drill in Gibsonburg at White Star Quarry.
- The department will participate in the NOVFA Fire Convention June 16 and 17 in Rossford. They will take truck '56 and Rescue I.
- The Sandusky County Fire Association will hold their May 31 meeting at the Woodville station. The program will be on the history of the Toledo Fire Museum.

FISCAL OFFICER – County Treasurer Irma Celestino will be at the fire station on Tuesday, June 27 from 10-11:30 a.m. to collect real estate taxes.

The American Red Cross collected 16 pints of blood at their May 11 bloodmobile at the station. Their next Woodville blood drive will be on July 27 at Solomon Lutheran Church and the blood drive after that will be on October 13 at the fire station.

At 9:45 p.m., with no further business, Trustee Heineman moved for adjournment. Trustee Green seconded. This meeting was held in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code's Sunshine Law.
